- 3. Members also provided contact information. If you are new or know someone who is new, please send updated information to Doug Sutton (Mt. Baker Bands) who maintains our current membership list. Doug can also send out information to certain groups within our membership, for example, band, elementary music, world music, etc.
- 4. Mitch DeGrace, (Meridian HS Band/Choir) gave his treasurer's report. Mitch will send this out to everyone.

 As you can see, we were pretty close to breaking even. The board recommended that some of the fees be raised to make sure we make a profit so we can use money for other events during the year.
- 5. There was then a quick discussion about giving a \$700.00 stipend to our treasurer/bookkeeper in addition to raising the fees. The amount for the treasurer/bookkeeper was decided by paying \$100.00 for large events and \$50.00 for smaller events. Both the stipend and the raising of fees was moved, seconded, and passed by the membership.
- 6. Brad Hendry (Sedro Woolley Bands) then talked about the adjudication forms that are used for Large Group Contests. It seems most of the instrumental groups like the voice recordings where adjudicators do commentaries during the

performance. Choral Directors do not like this as it interferes with the expression of the music. Most directors also seemed to like the descriptors given or written on the sheets. The problem seems to be the judges themselves have a preconceived idea as to the score each group should receive and they don't like doing the math to make the numbers match the score given to each group. Part of this problem seems to be that different size schools are on different scales which everyone seemed to want to keep. The final suggestion was to leave the chart off of the front of the form and to just indicate the size of the school. It was also suggested that we leave the descriptors on the inside of the sheet, but to not include numbers with those descriptors.

Breakout Sessions were then held for elementary, instrumental, and vocal music teachers.

Trisha invited everyone back into the room to finish up the food and to clean up.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:57 p.m.
